2015 marks the 6<sup>th</sup> year that Jackson Christian School has taken a group of students to Nicaragua Christian School over Spring Break. Although we only had 6 students in the group this year we had one of the best trips ever. We worked with the church that meets on campus during their very successful youth campaign. During the campaign there were 11 baptisms, most of which were 8<sup>th</sup> graders at the school (the oldest students on campus and thus leaders). Half the 8<sup>th</sup> grade class are now Christians. It is easy to see that God is working on campus and in the community. The synergy that exists because of Sandra and Dr. Armando is palpable. There is a feeling of teamwork, peace, and joy in the church there and on campus that is hard to explain. It's like all our prayers have been powerfully answered and God is challenging us to think even bigger.

We took inventory of all the books this year so that we would know what is lacking. The library now has roughly 900 books in it, and it is really seeing a lot of
